## **Activities**

The presbyters were able to meet four times in the year to discuss and plan for the congregation. Such meetings were open and frank but I think we should reconsider meeting every month as stated in our constitution since often there was need to call emergency meetings.

# **Children's Department**

The children in the congregation were well organized. They had separate services whenever the adults met for worship. Due to the interesting nature of their programmes they had some additions during the year to bring their number to ten. They always performed and acted what they had learnt to the adult congregation before the end of every worship service. When this is continued we hope to have children who are well nurtured in Christ to serve their community. We thank the teachers for the good work done.

### Youth

The youth in the congregation are not many but very active. They did not get the platform to assert themselves in the congregation as was done by the children. Almost all of them are still in college but they find time to attend church services.

They were not found wanting whenever they were called upon to read the bible or say a prayer. Their role in providing songs during Church service was well appreciated. We hope they would be supported to initiate activities of their interest in the coming year.

## Revival

There was a three-day revival in April 2009 on the theme: "Put on the whole armour of God". Attendance and participation was far better than the previous year.

During evaluation of the programme the Presbyters decided to organize such revivals at least two times in a year. It was also suggested that we should seek the possibility of inviting other speakers who would contribute to enrich the programme even more. Thank God for the vision of the presbyters to introduce this activity in the congregation.

## **Prayer Meeting**

Thank God the Thursday evening prayer meeting is growing from strength to strength. The Lord has been faithful and there are many testimonies of answered prayer by those who could make time to participate in this weekly exercise. We prayed for the Congregation, the church universal, individual requests, and the world at large. There was no aspect of life we did not commit to the Lord in prayer. Fortunately the doors are still opened to all who have the urge to join in this spiritual exercise.

#### **General Church Life**

The general life in the congregation is fairly good. Church services continue to be held every first Sunday and Bible Study on the third Sunday of the month. We are looking for the appropriate time where we can in introduce every Sunday Service.

Pentecost service with the Ghana Minstrel Choir came on as planned in the Glaubenskirche, Braunhubergasse 20, A-1110 Wien in May. An advent service was also held together with the Choir in the Evangelische Kirche Arche, in November 2009. These two events have been a regular activity organized by the Congregation and the Choir.

The fellowship meal after service also gave us the opportunity to interact with new comers. This kind of association was very helpful for many of the members.

# EAWM (EVANGELISCHER ARBEITSKREIS FÜR WELTMISSION)

The year 2009 began when Mr. Gottfried Mernyi left EAWM and was replaced by Mr. Lauri Hätönen in February. He took his time to settle in this new office, however the organization is still discussing what the future holds as the Evangelische Kirche in Österreich decided to cut down subvention as part of a restructuring exercise.

Board meetings were mostly to discuss this new trend and the challenges they bring. It is my prayer that we find a workable solution as we continue the discussions.

Supports for projects in Ghana continued during the course of the year. The Pastors' Association continued to support Programmes of Abokobi Women's Centre financially, especially the programme for the retired agents.

The students who were transferred from Dormaa Vocational Institute to Duayaw-Nkwanta Vocational institute continued to receive support from Austria to pay their fees and other bills.

# **PCG MINISTERS MEETING**

With the Support of the Evangelische Church office, the Vienna diocese and EAWM we hosted the Presbyterian Church of Ghana (PCG) ministers in Europe to a four-day meeting from the  $2^{nd}-5^{th}$  July 2009 in Vienna. We were privileged to have Bishop Dr. Michael Bünker, Mag. Hansjörg Lein, Superintendent of Vienna diocese, and Mag. Manfred Golda, board Chairperson of EAWM took turns to address the meeting. In addition they donated in cash and in kind to support the programme.

One great advantage was that the meeting gave all PCG ministers in Europe opportunity to know each other and to share experiences. During evaluation we decided to make the meeting a regular affair.





#### **VISITS**

We were invited to work in Schools more than congregations during the year. In June we attended the Gustav Adolf fest at the Kreuzkirche in Hietzing. In February the whole family was invited to Kärnten where we visited congregations in Ferffenit, Hermagor, and Klagenfurt. We shared with these congregations the story of Ghana and showed some artefacts peculiar to Ghanaians.

- o Die Informatik-Hauptschule in St. Andrä-Wördern (Greifensteinerstr. 31-35, 3423 St. Andrä-Wördern).

Our visits to these schools were very helpful for the children. Some of them became aware for the first time that Africa is a continent which has over fifty countries and different cultures. We were also able to connect some of the Children in these schools with some children in Ghana to exchange letter and share their experiences thus helping them to improve their writing skills. The only problem which needs to be improved is that when these children move higher in the academic pursuits and change schools it is difficult to monitor the exchanges which goes on between them.

This success chalked by the children in these schools suggests that we can connect congregations in Austria to Ghana so that they could directly share their faith experiences in a way that will be useful to both parties.

## Vacation

During the summer of 2009, Rev. Timothy Annoh and his family was given the opportunity to enjoy a mid-term vacation back home in Ghana. It was a great time of relaxation and reunion for the family. We are grateful to God and our partners for this rare opportunity.
